FALL PROTECTION TRAINING

Employers, supervisors and workers all have responsibilities in reducing or eliminating falls from heights. Falls are the leading cause of accidental death and injury in Ontario. Every day, 80 people are injured from falls at work. On average, each injury results in 4 weeks of lost time. (WSIB 2000)

Purpose

To equip workers and employers with the knowledge necessary to prevent fall related injuries and deaths from occurring in the workplace.

Objectives

To provide a basic understanding of fall protection with a focus on personal fall protection systems increasing worker safety while operating at heights. A combination of theory utilizing various teaching methods to appeal to all learning styles and hands-on training provided.

Who should attend

Any individual working at heights or directs workers to work at heights above 3 meters (10 feet) or preferably from above 6 feet*.

Program Highlights

The purpose of this course is to provide knowledge on the effective selection, use and care of fall protection equipment and understand when and how it is required. The following topics are covered:

- -Fall Arrest/Fall Restraint
- -Regulations and legislation
